It is the Councils duty to represent the residents and get answers for them. We should not have to wait an extended period of time to get an answer. Some issues need to be handled right away. Alderwoman Gazal said that the Administrator needs to be informed, but the Council should not have to get permission to speak with City staff. Mayor Soliman said that this will be addressed at a future work session. Alderperson Oberlin agrees that it is not right to tell employees that we hire that they cannot communicate with the Council.
